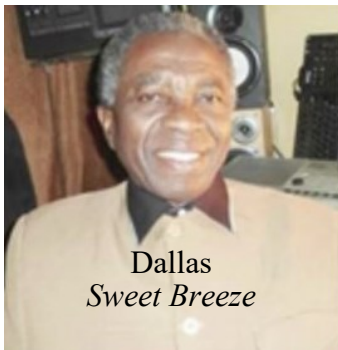

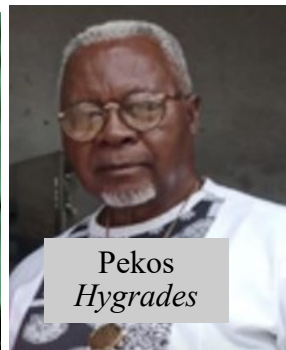

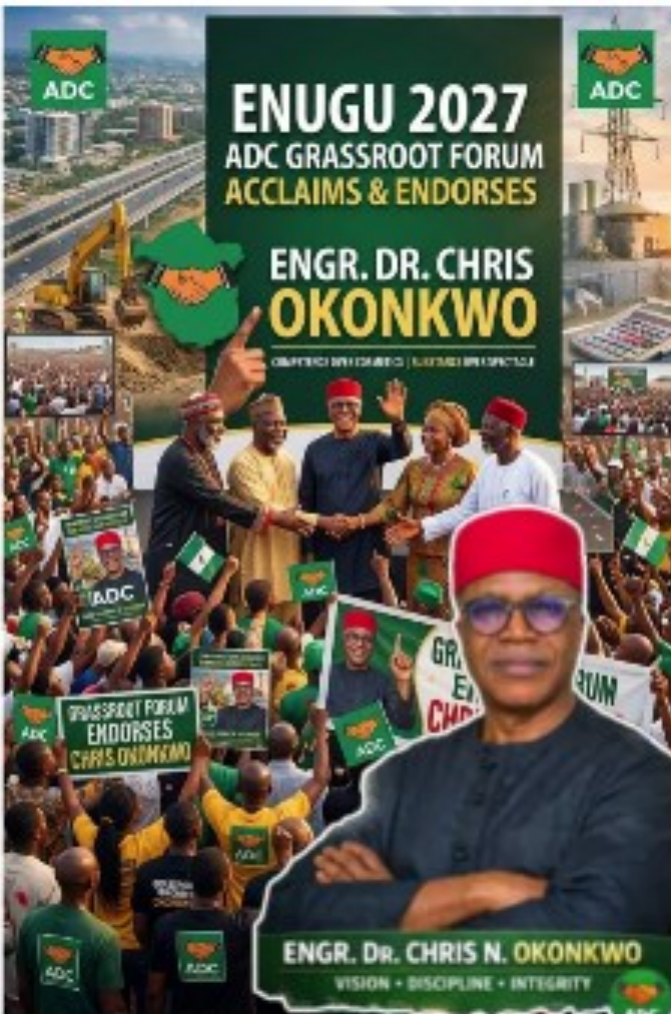

Nestor Dahni Wrote This Message. Frank Freds Nwosu Delivered It.

NESTOR DAHNI WROTE: It is preference. "Right now in Nigeria, one of the most difficult things to be is a genuine pastor, a man who simply teaches Christ, preaches repentance, and refuses to turn the altar into a stage. If you preach truth, you struggle. If you refuse to manipulate, you look "unanointed." If you won't promise cars, visas, contracts, and instant breakthroughs, you are called dry. Meanwhile, the false prophet arrives in town with noise, security, and spiritual branding. He throws around dramatic prophecies, tells people what they want to hear, and suddenly the same members who claim they are struggling financially appear with thick brown envelopes (money), eager to "connect to grace." It is not poverty that makes people withhold support from sound pastors.

Many church members don't want doctrine, they want drama. They don't want discipleship, they want destiny shortcuts. They don't want corrections, they want confirmation. So the pastor who labors in Scripture, who studies to teach accurately, who refuses to monetize prophecy, is left looking unsuccessful, while the one who commercializes anointing is successful. Funny enough, some believers are not deceived, they are complicit. They know exaggeration when they see it. They know manipulation when they hear it. But as long as the prophecy flatters them and promises speed, they will fund it. And we wonder why the number of genuine pastors are decreasing? Listen, you cannot finance deception and pray for revival.

You cannot starve truth and expect maturity. If the church keeps choosing excitement over substance, we will raise crowds, not disciples. The real tragedy is not that false prophets exist. They have always existed. The tragedy is that many believers prefer them. Until members value sound teaching more than sensational prophecy, genuine pastors will keep struggling to stay in ministry and the church will keep mistaking noise for power."

If you are seeking God, and you want to sit down and listen to someone, ask who knows Rev. Godwin Okwandu. Search for him. Find him. Meet him. Sit down and ask him to tell you about God. His teachings are as originally scriptural as anyone can find.

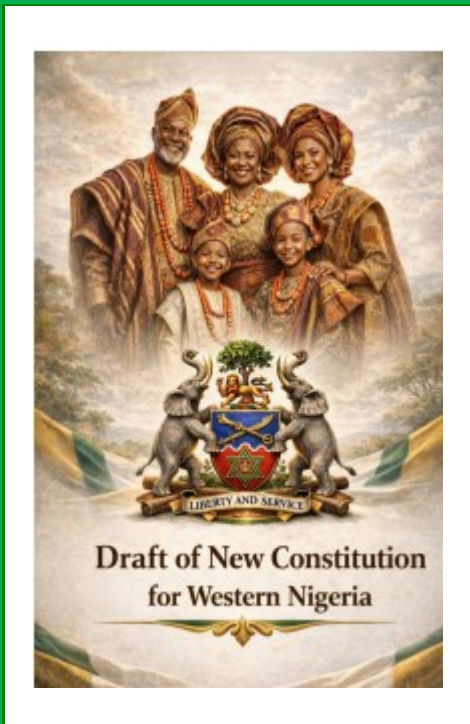

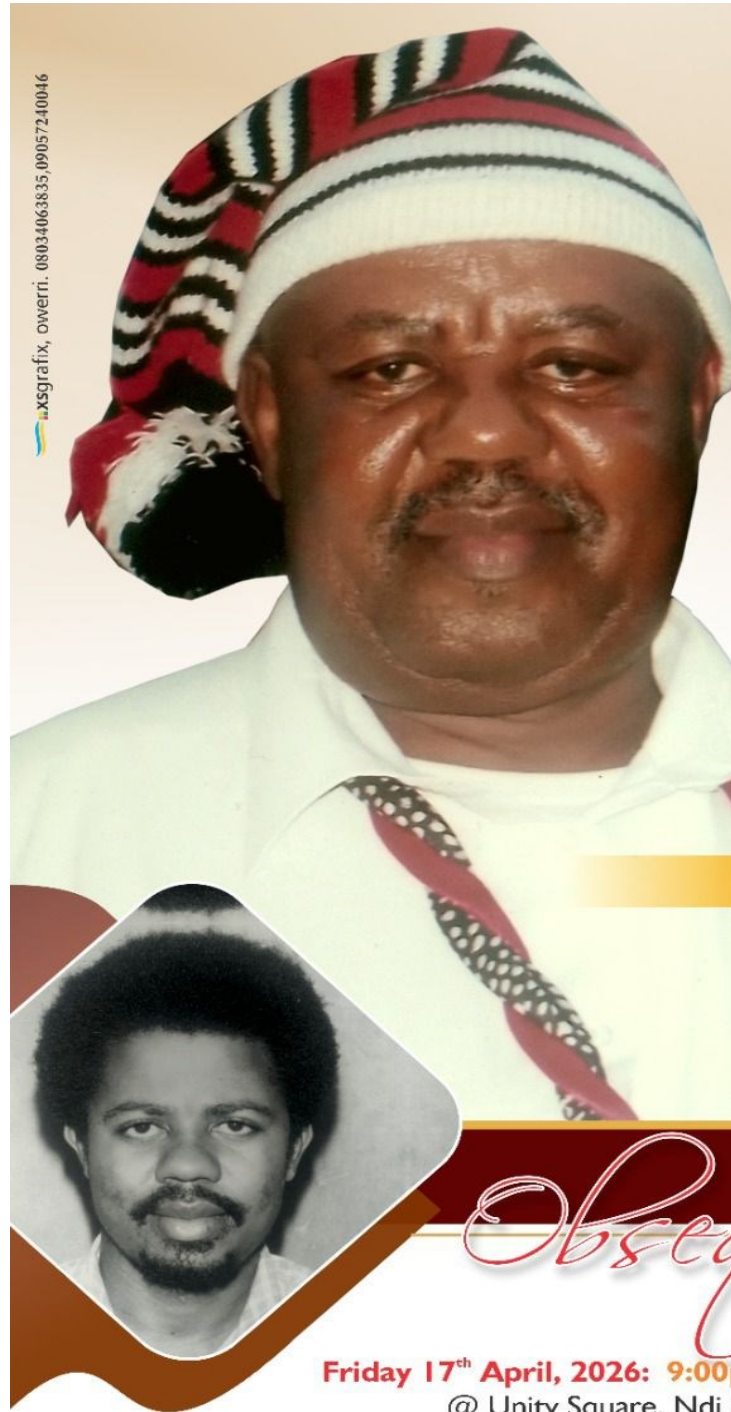

Sweet Unit Rock Group of Aba in the 1970s

This story has to start with the mention of the one and only Gilbert Wahehe Njoku. Otherwise, the story will be incomplete. Sweet Unit Rock Group was a band formed by a group of people some of whom were old friends and a few others who were new colleagues. The lineup was made up of Gilbert Wahehe Njoku, Joel Ugo, Reginal Njoku, Arthur Freds, Johnson Brown, and George Ema Black. Somewhere along the line, they brought in a saxophonist Archeles who spent some time before leaving for greener pastures. Gilbert Wahehe Njoku had played the guitar for a group called Semi-Colon under the leadership of Lasbery 'Colon' Ojukwu in Umuahia. It may be sensible to say that Gilbert Wahehe Njoku picked up the leadership format of Lasbery Colon while he was a member of the Semi-Colon. Wahehe became very popular while with Lasbrey's Semi Colon. So, when he decided to branch out, he implemented that leadership format. Other members of the Sweet Unit Rock Group were actually shareholders in terms of percentages received for the gigs. That shareholder status did not feature in the decision-making process. Wahehe sought their opinions and made decisions.

Gilbert Wahehe Njoku leveraged his connection with a highly reputable Aba-based Quantity Surveyor by name B. U. Nwaokeleme who underwrote the band's instruments. The Sweet Unit Rock Group entered Aba and was immediately loved by especially the student and trader class of the City. The first album of the band came out good. The songs on that album all belonged to Gilbert Wahehe Njoku. It can also easily be said that he used the opportunity of the band to express his musical genius, which can be seen in the tunes, quality, material, input and output. Wahehe played the lead and rhythm guitar. He loved the Fuss, Wah-wah, Phase, and Phlanger. George Ema Black was Vocalist. Arthur Freds played keyboards. Reginald Njoku played the drums. Joel Ugo played the Bass guitar. Johnson Brown played the congas. Archeles played the saxophone during his brief sojourn with the band. The Semicolon template worked very well at Sweet Unit Rock Group. Some bands have prominent members. However, that did not happen at Sweet Unit Rock Group. The only prominent member of the group was Gilbert Wahehe Njoku.

The band went through seasons (just like several other bands). While Wahehe was a seasoned veteran, Sweet Unit Rock Group was generally regarded by fans as a group of very young people. That perception and positioning helped sell the band to the general populace. Furthermore, Wahehe also leveraged his extreme popularity with his Mbaise roots, which made the band to frequently play in all parts of Mbaise. Wahehe's band is still playing gigs from place to place, and he is found on the Facebook. It is very important to mention that he raised his children to all be musicians, and they also perform from place to place. Just as Arthur Freds was getting ready to leave the band, Wahehe changed the name of the band to Rock of Ages. Wahehe brought Ani Opusunji to take Arthur Freds/ keyboard spot. By changing the band's name, Wahehe rebranded the group and made one or two recordings.

Through his academic work, he has guided doctoral candidates, published scholarly research, and supported the advancement of

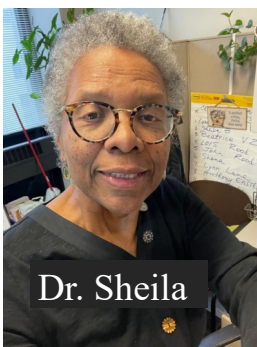
knowledge in management and the social sciences.

Many men will never admit it publicly, but deep inside they stopped trusting their wives years ago. Men who sacrificed everything for family only to grow old and discover they were no longer useful. Men who built houses but were later treated like visitors in them. Men who educated children who later treated them like burdens. Men who thought love guaranteed loyalty. It doesn't. SANITY knows that a MAN IS DAMNED IF HE DOES or DOESN'T. If he spends most of his time at home providing emotional support he may not provide enough material needs. And if he spends his time chasing money he will not provide enough emotional attachment. SANE MEN therefore must plan for their sunset years without expecting anything from those they slave for in their prime life." Harsh words. But to many men, this feels like hard-earned wisdom.

They begin to live carefully. They stop expecting gratitude. They stop expecting loyalty. They stop expecting love to last forever. Instead, they build quiet backup plans. Private. The follower continued with a brutal conclusion: "Not every man wearing a suit and driving a four-wheel drive car is sane. Many are SIMPS. SIMPS are the men who in their sunset years will sleep under bridges and dine with pigs and stray dogs after the very women and children they once worked so hard to please abandon them." It is a painful statement. But it reveals something deeper. Many couples today are not together because of love. They are together because of history, children, finances, social image, and fear of scandal. Behind the smiles at weddings, church events, and family gatherings are couples who:

- Haven't truly forgiven each other
- Haven't felt genuine affection in years

- Haven't shared emotional intimacy in decades
- They simply coexist under one roof.
- Each one surviving the years. Some quietly hoping the other dies first.
- This is not marriage. This is emotional cold war. And it raises a difficult question: When love dies in a marriage... why do so many people refuse to bury it honestly?
- Why do couples choose silent bitterness over honest decisions? And perhaps the hardest question of all: Is staying in a loveless marriage strength... or just fear wearing the mask of responsibility? Let's talk honestly. Because behind many "stable marriages" is a reality very few people dare to admit. There is a silent survival strategy in many marriages that nobody talks about. Not love. Not forgiveness. Not healing. Just survival.

The Offence of Bigamy Under Nigerian Law

Bigamy in Nigeria refers to the act of marrying someone while still legally married to another person. This practice is not permitted under Nigerian law and has severe legal consequences. The Laws addressing Bigamy are the Criminal Code and Penal Code applicable in the Southern and Northern States of Nigeria respectively. The Law regulating this offence is not only in our penal laws (i.e. criminal code and the penal code), it is equally in the Marriage Act (See Cap MTLFN 2004).

It is instructive to State *abi nitio* that polygamy, as a form of marriage is not frowned at in the non-christian Nigerian Society which recognizes it as an acceptable form of marriage. Under Native Laws and Customs and certain religious laws, marrying of many wives by a man is recognized and is acceptable. For instance, within the context of the Nigerian Society, Polygamous Marriages and Monogamous marriages are recognized. As a matter of fact, bigamy is one of the derivations of the Nigerian Criminal Law from English Law. It is categorized as an offence relating to marriage under the Nigerian Law.

However, Criminal Law prohibits duplicity of marriages in certain instances and this is where the offence of bigamy comes in. The Criminal Code in Section 370 provides for the offence of bigamy. A similar offence is in Section 384 of the Penal Code which provides for the offence of marrying again during the lifetime of husband and wife.

The Criminal Code which applies to the Southern States criminalizes bigamy. Section 370 of the Criminal Code defines bigamy as an offence that can lead to severe penalties. Anyone found guilty of contracting a second marriage during the subsistence of the first marriage may face up to seven years in prison. The law clearly States that both individuals involved in the bigamous marriage may be prosecuted.

The Penal Code which governs the

Northern States of Nigeria similarly recognizes bigamy as a criminal offence. Under Section 384 of the Penal Code, individuals who enter into a second marriage without dissolving the first are subject to criminal prosecution. The penalties under the Penal Code may vary, but the act of bigamy remains illegal and punishable by imprisonment.

The "Marriage Act" provides the legal framework for statutory marriages in Nigeria. Statutory marriages which are recognized and registered by the State must adhere to strict legal requirements. One of the key stipulations of the Marriage Act is that contracting a second marriage without the dissolution of the first is considered bigamy, which is illegal under Nigerian Law. This provision ensures that statutory marriages are monogamous and legally binding. See Section 48 of the Marriage Act.

While bigamy is strictly prohibited under the Criminal Code, Penal Code, and Marriage Act, it is instructive to indicate the exception. Nigeria recognizes different forms of marriage, including Customary and Islamic law marriage, where polygamy is permitted.

Under Islamic and Customary Laws, men are allowed to marry multiple wives, provided the marriages are conducted according to the relevant customs or religious practices. In these cases,

polygamy is not considered bigamy, and the individuals involved are not subject to the penalties outlined in the Criminal or Penal Codes.

The enforcement of bigamy laws in Nigeria can be complex and is often influenced by social, cultural, and religious considerations. In practice, the prosecution of bigamy is relatively rare and cases are typically brought to court only when there is a complaint from an aggrieved party, usually the first spouse.

The legal prohibitions notwithstanding, bigamy remains a significant issue in Nigeria, particularly in regions

where traditional and religions practices permit polygamy. The co-existence of different marriage Systems- Statutory, Customary, and Islamic creates unique legal and social challenges, making the enforcement of bigamy laws a nuanced and often contentious issue.

The *actus reus* of the offence of bigamy is the existence of an existing and valid marriage. The prosecution must prove there is an existing and valid marriage between the accused and the spouse. In the case of *Motoh V Motoh* (2011) 16 NWLR (pt 1274) 474 (A) and *The Queen V Prince Well* (1963) NWLR 54. The courts held that bigamy is not committed where the marriage had been dissolved or declared void by a competent court.

A case can only be instituted if the spouse of the accused is alive at the time of the subsequent marriage. Where the spouse dies before the accused marries, the offence is not committed. Where one of the parties was not of age, the offence cannot be prosecuted. In the case of *RV Inyang* (1946) 12 WACA 5, it was held that presentation of two marriage certificates is not proof that the first wife was alive at the time of the second marriage. The point to note is that where the accused is married under the Marriage Act and marries again under the same Act while the former marriage is still subsisting and valid and the spouse alive, this will definitely be bigamy. See the case of *Motoh V Motoh* (2011) 16 NWLR (pt 2174) 474 CA, and *The Queen V PrinceWell* (1963) supra.

A spouse has a defence under Section 370 of the Criminal Code which provides that the other spouse has been absent for a space of seven years and has not been heard of by the accused of being alive within that time. See the case of *RV Tolson* (1889) 23 QbD168. It is also good defence that the accused honestly believed, on reasonable grounds that the previous marriage was invalid. See the case of *RV King* (1963) 3ALLER 561.
