


Understanding Global Health: A Big Picture View

Global health is all about improving health and achieving equity in health for people worldwide. It's not just about fighting diseases that cross borders; it also focuses on the systems, policies, and cultural factors that impact health globally (Skolnik, 2021). The key components of global health include disease prevention, health promotion, international health systems, health equity, and cross-border collaborations. One crucial piece is recognizing the social determinants of health, things like education, income, and access to clean water, that significantly impact populations.

Now, the differences between developed and developing countries are stark when we compare global health. Developed nations usually have better access to advanced medical technology, stronger healthcare infrastructure, and longer life expectancies. In contrast, developing countries often deal with higher rates of infectious diseases, maternal and child mortality, and a lack of basic healthcare services (World Health Organization (WHO), 2023). However, both face challenges with non-communicable diseases (NCDs) like heart disease and diabetes, which are on the rise globally.

Speaking of NCDs, their increasing prevalence is one of the biggest concerns in global health today. A few reasons for this rise include urbanization, sedentary lifestyles, tobacco and alcohol use, and unhealthy diets. As countries develop and adopt more Western lifestyles, we're seeing a surge in conditions like obesity, hypertension, and type 2 diabetes, even in places where these were once rare (Bollyky et al., 2023).

That's where **global health economics** comes in. This area looks at how resources are allocated to maximize health outcomes worldwide. Key concepts include cost-effectiveness, health financing, and economic evaluation of health interventions. It also explores how investments in health can yield economic benefits, for instance, a healthier workforce tends to be more productive and less of a financial burden on governments (Jakovljevic et al., 2020).

An exciting and growing approach to address NCDs is **integrated behavioral health (IBH)**. This model combines physical and mental health services to treat the whole person, often in primary care settings. Integrating services helps catch behavioral factors contributing to chronic diseases, like stress, substance use, or poor sleep, early and more effectively (Kathol et al., 2022). It's also culturally adaptable, making it a strong contender for improving global health outcomes, especially in underserved communities.

Looking at a specific country, **China's health care system** has undergone significant transformations. Historically, it was heavily state-run under the "barefoot doctor" model in rural areas, which focused on basic care and prevention. After economic reforms in the 1980s, a shift toward market-based healthcare created some inequality. China has recently reformed its public health system to expand insurance coverage and improve primary care access (Yip et al., 2021). Public hospitals still dominate today, but there's a growing emphasis on community health and digital health innovation since post-COVID-19.



Critical Evaluation


By Sigmund Freud

Does evidence support Freudian psychology? Freud's theory is good at explaining but not predicting behavior (which is one of the goals of science). For this reason, Freud's theory is unfalsifiable – it can neither be proved true or refuted. For example, the unconscious mind is difficult to test and measure objectively. Overall, Freud's theory is highly unscientific. Despite the skepticism of the unconscious mind, cognitive psychology has identified unconscious processes, such as procedural memory (Tulving, 1972), automatic processing (Bargh & Chartrand, 1999; Stroop, 1935), and social psychology has shown the importance of implicit processing (Greenwald & Banaji, 1995). Such empirical findings have demonstrated the role of unconscious processes in human behavior.

However, most evidence for Freud's theories is from an unrepresentative sample. He mostly studied himself, his patients, and only one child (e.g., Little Hans). The main problem here is that the case studies are based on studying one person in detail, and regarding Freud, the individuals in question are most often middle-aged women from Vienna (i.e., his patients). This makes generalizations to the wider population (e.g., the whole world) difficult. However, Freud thought this unimportant, believing in only a qualitative difference between people. Freud may also have shown research bias in his interpretations – he may have only paid attention to information that supported his theories, and ignored information and other explanations that did not fit them.


Do You Remember Beni Tudumey?

The one and only Beni Tudumey was sighted in Enugu City taking life easy. You could never believe that this was the man who played freaking solos, chords, phrases, and stuff. Watch out for him on the songs, *I Am Your Captain*, *P-O-T-E-N-T-I-A-L (Potential)*, *My Dreams*, *Funky Stuff*, etc., etc.,



Once up on a time, in the City of Aba in Nigeria, there was a music group called Friimen Music Coy. That band refused to do what other bands were doing. They carved their own niche. If you saw them at their rehearsal grounds, you would say without a doubt that the band was a candidate for Billboard #1 spot. When you listen to their albums, you would say the same thing. However, they shunned the market and played music. They were rather musicologists instead of musicians. Their performance at shows was in a class of its own as they dished out precise funk that a listener would nod to the rhythm. The line up at the time under reference included Jimi Henshaw, Kenneth Okogbue. Beni Tudumey, Charlie Eze. In the center of that production was the indefatigable keyboardist Beni Tudumey! When you heard his keyboard lines, you would think it was Jimi Smith playing.

When they started concentrating on writing their own songs, the group instantly took off and became an overnight hit that resulted in them doing multiple successful nationwide tours. FRIIMEN would go on to record three albums: *Free Man* (1976), *We Can Get It On* (1978) and *Merry Man* (1979). All three albums were released on the Aba based label Anodisc Records (THE key label to be on if you wanted your music heard and out there), Anodisc also released hit records by 'Sweet Unit' and 'Voice Of The Cross' but The Friimen Muzik Company was the label's signature band. The Friimen Muzik Company was so solid that every new group would then first consult the

At another time, you would think you were hearing Herbie Hancock. You won't know when he modulates and runs minor scales on the same music! What? How does he do that? Beni Tudumey single-handedly mentored Arthur Freds, held Arthur Freds by the hand, took Arthur Freds to the first rehearsal of Arthur Freds Group, Sweet Unit Rock Group of Aba, Nigeria the first day Sweet Unit Rock band started its journey as a new group. Beni Tudumey stayed at that rehearsal to make sure Arthur Freds did not walk away. Beni influenced Arthur Freds extensively to make sure Arthur Freds succeeded. A musician leaves a legacy when he mentors another artist to succeed. THE FRIIMEN MUZIK COMPANY (also known as FRIIMEN) was formed after the Biafran war in 1973-1974 in the town of ABA in the eastern part of Nigeria. Aba was the Number 1 Music Hub in the entire Eastern Region of Nigeria. While bands and artists like 'Ofege' and 'Fela Kuti' ruled the LAGOS scene, bands like 'Friimen' and 'The Apostles' were ruling the ABA scene. Before forming the band, most of its members were already working together as freelance session musicians backing up solo artists on many recordings



and concerts (or were playing in military bands that gradually became civilian bands because the war had just ended). FRIIMEN members' credits were numerous and they played, wrote or performed on recordings from well-known acts like The Funkees, The Jets, The Apostles...and countless others.

label, or artist wanted the Friimen to back them up in the recording studio. As a result, Anodisc Records received tons of demo cassettes from aspiring artists...the label would then first consult the Friimen members to see if these new acts were worthy of giving a chance to record and release an album for Anodisc. Over the course of the years the band went through several line-up changes...but in 1980 the band finally broke up and their story came to an end. The album we are presenting you today (*Free Man* from 1976) was recorded at the famous Decca Studios in Lagos and comes swinging right out of the gate with a set of no less than EIGHT monster tunes. Expect nothing less than crazy

afrobeat and over the top melodic funk influenced by a wide array of artists (both local and international). Mesmerizing solos, captivating grooves, impeccable sequences that turned many heads...everything you need to get a dancehall into a complete uproar. The musicians' skills are just plain incredible! *FREE MAN* is a quintessential record that every serious collector or fan needs to have in his/her collection. Originally released in 1976 on Anodisc Records Nigeria. The Mbaise-born Beni Tudumey, based in Coal City of Enugu in Eastern Nigeria, serving the Performing Musicians Association of Nigeria as General Secretary, is ex-officio in many music bodies in his country.
