LEGAL REQUIREMENTS FOR STARTING A BUSINESS IN NIGERIA - Professor Mike Nwosu, Ph.D.

Mike Chike Nwosu is a Lawyer and a Professor of Public Policy and Administration.

Starting a business or company in Nigeria may not be as expensive as starting one in other countries. Beside having money (capital), and advertising, you must be ready to meet up the legal requirements.

A prospective businessman or Entrepreneur will start by identifying the area he intends to ply. Then he contacts a Lawyer to engage in the registration in the Corporate Affairs Commission. However, the use of a Lawyer is not compulsory, but Lawyers make the process easier.

They include Incorporated Trustees for businesses like Schools, Churches, Non Governmental Organization and Associations. The second is Limited Liability which is largely for everyday businesses. The third is Business Name Registration. The business name registration is for small time businesses, like Sole Proprietorship, Enterprises, Law firms etc.

The Corporate Affairs Commission has three Streams of registration. (depending on the type of business). These include:

Nigerian Investment Promotion Commission (NIPC)

Tax issues with Nigerian Inland Revenue Services (NIRS)

Registration with the State and Local Government (when applicable).

Registration with Economic and Financial Crime Commission for businesses in real estate, fintech, Consultancy etc.

Registration with NAFDAC, SON etc.

As aforesated, the primary law governing companies and businesses in Nigeria is the Company and Allied Matters Act (CAMA).

It deals with the various types of company structures, eligibility, process for registration, and rules for operation of the business.

Law provides lawful recognition to businesses. If a business does not get legal recognition, then the entrepreneur would be in great mess.

Meeting the requirements of the Law allow your business to run smoothly, protect it to a large degree, make it look trustworthy, and prevent legal issues.

The benefits of CAC registration include:

Certificate of incorporation
Reputation; Legal protection;
Loans; Expatriate Quota (for companies that intend to bring in foreign professionals)

Export/Import permit
Bank Account Opening and Capital Importation.

The major problem with running businesses in Nigeria includes: Power inadequacy, insecurity, and Multiple taxation. Despite the challenges, Nigeria has huge population, wonderful climate, verse land and energetic people. Virtually every business thrives in Nigeria: “pure water” to investments in Fintech, Power sector, Real estate and even Church business.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP 101

Entrepreneurship is certainly the vehicle that will take you all the way to the top.

The World that we live today, and the World that you will build your career in favours the entrepreneur.

If you are in your twenties, you may forge a second or third career as an entrepreneur, and if you are in your forties, or beyond, you will decidedly favour the idea of starting and owning your own business. Today you can start a business with a laptop, a wireless cable connection, and a very strong LinkedIn profile. The best vehicle for reaching the top and for controlling your own destiny is entrepreneurship.

The entrepreneur is a person who sees an opportunity to serve people in some way with a product or service that they want and need, and then is able to bring this product or service to the customer at a cost that is lower than the customer is willing to pay.

Researches over the years have shown that no one will buy from you until they like you and trust you. You must establish trust.

How do you establish trust? By being more concerned about helping the customers improve

their lives or work than about selling your product. As soon as a customer feels that all you want to do is sell your product, it's over. They no longer have any interest in dealing with you..

So how do you build trust? How do you build rapport? How do you learn the customer's needs? How do you help the customer make a good choice? How do you make sure the customer gets the right product or service?

You do it by asking questions. Good sales people, good business people, good leaders ask a lot of questions so that they are very well -informed.

Harvard University did an Incredible fifty year study, conducted by Edward Banfield. They found that the most important factor that determines economic success is Long -term thinking. Think into the next generation. Long-term thinking is about goals.

It is trite that the difference between a Politician and a Statesman is that a Politician thinks about the next election, while a Statesman thinks about the next generation.

The essence of entrepreneurship is to find something that people want and need and are willing to pay for

and to sell it to them. Ambition accounts for 80% or more of success. If a person is ambitious enough, is driven enough, is determine enough to be successful, nothing will stop them.

There is an interesting story about the difference between the American attitude and the European attitude. In the United States, if you start a business and you go broke, you can start a new business the next day. In Europe, if you start a business and you go broke, you are looked down upon as though you have committed some awful crime. It is a terrible thing to lose money if you go out.

Someone once asked "Why are the people in Europe content to live in a welfare system, have lower wages, and have the government take care of almost everything for them from cradle to grave, whereas in the U.S, everyone is entrepreneurial. The reply is "The U.S is made up of people who left, and Europe is made up of people who stayed: In other words No ambition".


